School attendance continues to be a major indicator of student success, one that we stress here at Green Springs School. If your child is not here, we cannot help them! Excellent attendance not only has a significant impact on grades and learning new material, it also builds great responsibility. This year, tardies have been very frequent as many students have been arriving to school late each morning. This can be very disruptive to the class as they are already busy with the day's lessons. It can also put students behind as they miss instruction that begins right away after our bell. Please pay close attention to have your child arrive at school with enough time to make it to their classroom. Students may arrive as early at 8:25 so they have time to settle in before our tardy bell rings at 8:45 and school begins. Our office will continue to monitor attendance closely and send attendance letters as students miss days or are tardy. As a last resort, we do participate in truancy mediation with the Sandusky County Juvenile Court to be sure our students are here at school and ready to learn.
