NEWS FROM MR. STOCKMASTER, PRINCIPAL

The excitement of the holidays is certainly alive here at Green Springs School. This week our Student Council is helping to pro-

mote the "Caring for Clyde Kids Toy Drive" that takes place each year in our communities and helps bring many smiles to students right here in our own district. Next week they will be promoting our annual food drive that helps our local food pantry for those in need. Our second and third graders are busily preparing for their annual music program next week and many other outstanding and unique projects are taking place in the class-rooms. This year the winter break, which begins on December 23rd, will mark the end of the first semester.

Last year I heard a great deal of concern from the community regarding the state testing that our school is required to participate in. Many of these concerns are shared by those of us in the education field and a great deal of feedback was provided to those in Columbus. Lawmakers in Ohio heard some of our concerns and did make some changes to these requirements. I will attempt to provide a brief summary of this year's requirements that Green Springs School must follow.

The required tests are referred to as "Ohio's State Tests" and they are measuring student progress on "Ohio's Learning Standards." This year new tests were developed in the areas of English language arts and mathematics by the American Institutes of Research (AIR). AIR currently provides Ohio's science and social studies tests as well. This year's test length will be shorter than last year and will be given in one window near the end of the year rather than two windows like last year. This is a definite benefit to our students. Each test will last around three hours and will be divided into two sessions. Students in grades 3 through 5 will take both English language arts and mathematics. Students in grade 4 will take social studies, and students in grade 5 will take science. All tests will be taken on computers in a web based format.

Ohio's Learning Standards and the new Ohio's State Tests not only require the knowledge of subject matter, but they require students to use this knowledge in complex, real world skills such as critical thinking, problem solving, and writing. I want to assure our students, parents, and community that our school staff is doing all we can to prepare our students for these new standards. We are working with our students to learn these new skills as they interact with information, respond to multiple parts of a question, solve problems, and use writing to explain their answers. These skills are very difficult for young learners to master and we are doing our best to help them learn the necessary knowledge as well as the thinking skills they need to apply that knowledge.
